Alpaca Show Rules

1. Rules and Regulations: General Rules and Regulations apply to this division as well as those rules listed below.
2. The Alpaca Show is sponsored by the Alpaca Breeders of the Rockies and entrants must abide by all rules and regulations of the Alpaca Breeders of the Rockies and the National Western Stock Show.
3. The Alpaca Halter Show is open to Farm Members of the Alpaca Breeders of the Rockies in good standing as of August 31, 2018. The Performance Show is open to all Youth and Adult Alpaca Enthusiasts (5-18). Performance Show entrants must be the age listed for the class as of January 1, 2019. The halter show is open to yearlings and two year olds and over/mature.
4. A LIMITED NUMBER OF STALLS WILL BE AVAILABLE. Stalls will be assigned by the Show Superintendent on a first come, first served basis. Number of stalls per farm is limited to five (5) stalls. Maximum number of Yearling alpacas in stalls is four (4) and Two and over alpacas is three (3). Exhibitors must participate in the halter or performance show to purchase stalls.
5. Only Alpacas entered in the Halter or Performance Show are allowed on the grounds of the NWSS.
6. All Alpacas must have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection issued by a licensed veterinarian in the state of origin within thirty (30) days prior to the date of the show. This certificate must also show a treatment for scabies within thirty (30) days prior to date of show. The certificate must be available upon request by animal health officials or the show superintendent. All Alpacas must be accompanied by a copy of a negative BVD test. Alpacas without the proper health certificates will not be allowed on the grounds. An ARI certification must be sent to Kim Kastner, PO Box 1169, Morrison, CO 80465.
7. Alpacas should be entered in the correct color class (see color class list). Classes will be combined if necessary.
8. FEES: FEES DUE AT CHECKOUT
 - a. HALTER - Twenty dollars (\$20.00) per animal per class. PERFORMANCE - Five dollars (\$5.00) per participant per alpaca per class.
 - b. STALLS: Thirty five dollars (\$35.00) per stall. Stalls are 8' x 10' x 4'. (One bag of cardboard per stall included).
 - c. PARKING PERMITS and PARTICIPANT (owner/exhibitor). Exhibitor Badges can be purchased online & at check in. Trailer parking is at Coors Field and outlying lot(s). Permits may be purchased there.
9. Entry Forms: Enter online at www.nationalwestern.com or request a form from the National Western Livestock Office at 303-299-5559. Questions concerning the Alpaca Show should be directed to Kim Taha, 303-704-7928, kim@tahaalpacas.com.
10. Ribbons will be awarded to the top six (6) places and Banners for Champion, Reserve Champion and Grand Champion for Halter Classes. Ribbons will be awarded to the top six (6) places for Obstacles and Public Relations Classes and Banners for Champion and Reserve Champions for the Obstacles and Public Relations. Ribbons for the Costume class will be awarded to the top five (5) places. Championships will only be awarded to classes with 3 or more alpacas.
11. This is a premium payout show based on the Alpaca Show Premium List.
12. Exhibitors should dress appropriately to showcase the Alpaca.

Championships will only be rewarded to classes with three (3) or more alpacas. Alpacas 6 months (as of January 13, 2019) and older may be entered in the Performance Show.

1. Entry Fees. An entry fee of eight dollars (\$8.00) per fleece will be charged on all fleeces entered for competition.

2. Purpose. The purpose of this show is to encourage the production of high quality alpaca fleece; to promote proper handling, grading and preparation for market; to create an awareness of the many qualities of alpaca fleece and its uses.

3. Eligibility of Participants. Farm or Fiber Associate Members of the Alpaca Breeders of the Rockies as of August 31, 2018 may enter alpaca fleece(s).

4. Entry Limitations. No fleece can compete in more than one (1) class except for special prizes. Color categories are: Black, Brown, Fawn, Lights (light fawn and beige), White, Grey and Multi's. Ages are: (A) 6 months to 12 months (juvenile), (B) First birthday through 24 months (yearling), (C) Second birthday and over.

5. Eligibility of Fleeces. In order to be entered in the Alpaca Fleece Show each fleece must:

a. Have been shorn in 2018.

b. Represent no more than twelve (12) months' growth, except in the case of yearling (B) fleeces, when up to sixteen (16) month's growth will be allowed for Huacaya or twenty four months (24) for Suri.

6. The Alpaca Fleece Show Coordinator reserves the right to inspect any fleece entered to determine its eligibility and color placement.

7. Qualifications. Any fleece entered for competition shall be discriminated against if:

a. Staple length is less than three inches.

b. Showing a weak staple or break in the fiber.

c. Containing any excess burrs or other vegetable matter, or poly twine fragments.

8. Preparation of Fleeces. All fleeces shall be rolled cut side out in a manner to allow their being handled without falling apart. It is recommended that exhibitors pack fleeces rather loosely in clear plastic bags so as not to impair their character or attractiveness.

9. Each bag of fleece must contain a completed "Alpaca Fleece Show Entry Tag" and a copy of the ARI certificate. These tags will be available thru the ABR website, www.alpacabreeders.org. Any help needed to fill these out, contact Mary Ann Mahaffey, 303-521-2784, info@AbsarokaAlpacas.com.

10. Entries close December 17, 2018 and fleeces must be delivered to the show on January 10, 2019 between 12:00 Noon and 5:00 PM. E-mails will alert you to other drop-off areas. Mailed in fleeces will be accepted if received by December 28, 2018. Mail to Mary Ann Mahaffey, 32400 E 140th Way, Brighton, CO 80603 and include return postage. Fleece(s) will be mailed back after January 14, 2019.

11. **Fleeces will be released for pick-up Sunday, January 13, 2019, from 12:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m.** Participants may pick up fleeces at the stock show or must make arrangements for pick up. To make special arrangements for pick-up, contact Mary Ann Mahaffey (see contact info above).

12. In the case of any controversy relative to the classification of any fleece offered in exhibition, affidavits from the Participants may be required. However, in all such controversies involving any interpretation of these rules and regulations, the decision of a committee consisting of the Alpaca Fleece Show Coordinator, the Alpaca Fleece Show Judge and the National Western Stock Show Management shall be final.

13. The Alpaca Fleece Show Coordinator reserves the right to combine classes if the number of entries in any individual class does not warrant a separate class and to place entries in appropriate classes and divisions as necessary.

14. All fleeces will be displayed in clear plastic bags.

15. The Alpaca Breeders of the Rockies, Inc. and the National Western Stock Show Association are not responsible for fleeces entered in the Alpaca Fleece Show and/or Alpaca Fleece Silent Auction.
