

CATCH-A-CALF CONTEST

In order that all boys and girls who compete in this contest will be on an even basis, uniform calves have been selected.

1. General Rules and Regulations and Junior Livestock Rules and Regulations found in this Livestock Premium List apply to this division.

2. Open to 4-H Club members and residents from Colorado, Kansas, Wyoming or Nebraska who presently have adequate facilities to raise and handle a calf. County Extension agents must certify these standards are complied with by the member. Members living in counties without a county agent will not be able to compete in the contest.

3. Contestant must have reached the age of twelve (12) years, and have the consent of his/her parents, but must be under nineteen (19) years of age on January 1, 2020, and must participate in 4-H as an active member in 2020.

4. Any Colorado, Kansas, Wyoming or Nebraska 4-H member and residents who wishes to compete in the Catch-A-Calf Contest must submit an application form properly signed by the member's parent and County Extension agent. Applications are completed online and followed up with signature page to be sent to Amy Kelley, PO Box 517, Fort Morgan, CO 80701, phone 970-542-3545, email-Amy.Kelley@colostate.edu, not later than December 1, 2019. Application forms can be obtained from County Agents or www.nationalwestern.com/catch-a-calf-program/.

5. Applicants entering this contest do so at their own risk, and acknowledge that they could be injured by participating. The National Western Stock Show will not be responsible for any injury connected with this contest. In addition, the NWSS will not be responsible for any harm caused by the calf during the ownership period of the 4-H club member.

6. All applications will be reviewed for completeness. 4-H Club Members who are accepted will be notified in advance as to the time they will participate.

7. Contestants will be permitted to take a rope halter with no more than a 10-foot lead into the arena. The halter or rope cannot be used as a lariat. The halter must be placed on the animal in the usual way.

8. After a member has caught a calf in the National Western Catch-A-Calf Contest, he or she is not eligible to enter again.

9. An agreed upon donation of ten (10%) of gross selling price will be deducted on each calf by the National Western Stock Show at time of sale and will be treated as a donation to the NWSS to be put into a revolving fund to ensure the continuation of the Catch-A-Calf program. It is agreed and understood by the 4-H member that the calf shall be in joint project with the National Western Stock Show.

10. Two (2) calves will be selected for the Auction of Junior Champions to be held Friday, January 23, 2021. Those calves will be selected on points using a formula which includes Record Book, Sponsor Relations, Interview, Production, Live Placing and Showmanship. These two (2) calves will be designated following the awards portion of the Catch-A-Calf Show.

PRODUCTION PHASE

In this class, awards will be based on the beef production job done by the exhibitor. The steers were weighed when presented to the members in May 2019 and points will be awarded for the following:

1. Sponsor Relation Letters
2. Record Books
3. Industry Index (Weight gain, cost of gain, and feed efficiency)
4. Interview

Ed Snell Family awards a belt buckle to the High Individual in the Production Phase.

Jim Koester Memorial Award. A belt buckle will be presented to the second place individual in the Production Phase, on behalf of Jim & Doris Koester

CARCASS PHASE

After placing of the steers, all Catch-A-Calves will be shipped to a packing plant where carcass data will be collected. Each carcass will be ranked and additional premiums (same as listed above) will be paid to winners in 1st-15th place. The carcass data, using adjusted yield, will be basis for premiums.

If tie scores develop in scoring the contest, the member having the highest score on his record book will be given the advantage.

The Waneka Family will present a special award for the Top Individual in the Carcass Phase.

SHOWMANSHIP PHASE

The showmanship phase will consist of 3 age divisions. The Showmanship classes will be held prior to the live placing classes. The top showman in each age division will receive a special award presented by the **SLW Ranch, Greeley, CO.** (No additional fee needed).

LIVE PLACING PHASE

Steers will be shown "on the hoof" by weight. There will be four (4) classes. \$10.00 of the entry fee will be used for the jackpot purse. FO or fitting rules please refer to the Juniot Show rules on page 203 in the premium book

The Peebles Family will award plaques to each of the class winners in the Live Placing Phase.

INTERVIEW PHASE

The interview portion of the project will take place at the National Western Stock Show. The purpose of the interview is for the Catch-A-Calf committee to have the opportunity to speak with each contestant individually and ask questions about the project experience. Additionally, by participating in the interviews, each participant will have the opportunity to develop their public speaking and interview skills. Interviews are 5 minutes and each contestant will be required to present a 2 minute speech on the designated topic, with the remaining 3 minutes being used to answer questions from the panel of judges. The interview is worth 25 points total (speech is worth a maximum of 10 points and the questions from the judge's panel are worth a maximum of 15).

SPECIAL AWARDS

National Western Stock Show will award plaques to the top three (3) individuals in Record Keeping.

Jim Peri Memorial Award for the Catch-A-Calf Herdsman. The plaque will remain in the possession of National Western Stock Show and be displayed in the Livestock Office. Each year the winning herdsman's name will be added to the plaque.

Colorado Elks Association. Mr. Kenny Burns awards a belt buckle to the Herdsman award winner

Olivia Barden will present awards to the top three individuals in Sponsor Relations.

AUCTION OF JUNIOR LIVESTOCK CHAMPIONS

Two (2) calves will qualify for the Auction of Junior Livestock Champions held on Friday, January 24th. These 2 calves, which will be designated Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Catch-A-Calves, will be selected using a point system which includes: Record Book - 50 pts., Sponsor Relations - 40 pts., Interview - 25 pts., Production - 10 pts., Live Placing - 10 pts., Showmanship - 20 pts., Deadlines met - 5 pts., with a possible 160 pts. The two calves must have placed in the top 4 of live placing. In the case of a tie it will be broken using participants interview score. The participant will receive the buy back price minus deductions required by state regulations, such as, but not limited to Colorado Beef Board, Colorado Brand Board, freight charges etc. From the remaining portion of the sale price, 20% to the participant, 30% distributed to various aspects of the Catch-A-Calf Program and 50% to be divided between the rest of the participants. **THESE TWO CALVES WILL ALSO BE DRUG TESTED FOR FOREIGN AND PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES.**
