1. All entries are online at livestockentry.nationalwestern.com
2. NWSS does not mail any credentials out before the show. All passes, badges and other permits are picked up at the Gate 7 Satellite Office upon arrival to the show. Free parking is included with entry.
3. There is no on-site trailer parking at NWSS. We recommend all trailers parking at Coors Field who offers 24-7 monitoring. Directions and details will be provided upon arrival.
4. **There is no outside bedding permitted at NWSS.** All bedding must be purchased through the NWSS Feed Store online at store.nationalwestern.com or in-person when you arrive on grounds. The Feed Store hours are 7AM-7PM daily.
5. No dogs are allowed on grounds.
6. **NEW for 2022:** Join us in celebrating the grand opening of the new NWSS Yards and welcome everyone back to Denver at one of our three Exhibitor Appreciation Parties, all located in the Stockyards Event Center. Friday, January 7; Friday, January 14; or Thursday, January 20. More information will be provided upon arrival.
7. **Premise ID is required with all junior market livestock entries.**
 - A. **What is a Premise ID?** Premise identification (Premise ID) is a part of the National Animal Identification System (NAIS) being developed to identify animals and track them as they move from one location to another. The purpose of the program is to create a database that will allow a rapid traceback in the event of a disease concern. Youth may already have premise ID number for the farm where their 4-H animals are being cared for. To obtain your Premise ID number, please contact your local Extension office or do an internet search of “(your state) Premise ID”. They are free of charge and must be provided on your junior market entries.
