1. Entries:

- A. All NWSS livestock entries are online at livestockentry.nationalwestern.com.
- B. Entry Fees: Entry fees are \$15.00 per participant. Free parking included with entry.
- **C.** Participants must upload a short 2/3 page typed resume to your online account. You may also email your resume to livestock@nationalwestern.com The typed resume must be double-spaced and cover no more than 2/3 of an 8.5" x 11" sheet of paper. It must include the participant's name and address; a brief summary of the participant's background; a description of the garments and animal the participant will exhibit; and include the sponsor's name if applicable. The announcers will read each resume over the microphone during the promenade in the ring. A guide to name pronunciation would be appreciated.
- **D.** Any exhibitor of breeding sheep may enter this contest and/or sponsor as many participants as they wish. Participants not leading their own sheep must acknowledge the sponsor in their resume.
- E. Age of eligibility (when applicable) is based on Participant's age as of January 1, 2022.

2. Special Rules:

- **A.** General Rules and Regulations, Health Regulations and Junior Livestock Show Rules and Regulations found in the Livestock Premium List apply to this division as well as those rules listed in each specific division. All Participants must read and abide by these rules.
- **B.** To gain access to the National Western grounds and to receive entry number(s) for the competition, you must pick up an information packet (includes credentials) at the Livestock Satellite Office, Gate 7 entrance located off of Brighton Blvd. All participants must report to the Superintendent at the show ring no later than thirty (30) minutes prior to the beginning of the contest. Participants must be dressed and ready for the competition at that time.
- **C.** Sheep that are used in the Lead do not have to be registered ewes and may be any breed or crossbreed. Ewes must be conditioned, fitted and trained to show at halter. All rules for exhibiting sheep at the National Western Stock Show are applicable.
- **D.** Participants in this contest should have a sheep background or an interest in sheep and wool. Participant will be judged on the garment he or she exhibits. The garment does not have to be hand made, but it must be at least fifty (50%) percent wool. Winners of previous Sheep Lead contests are eligible for entry, however, the garment must be different from that which was worn in previous contest(s).

3. Judging Standards:

The objective of this contest is to give participants an opportunity to display their fashion and sheephandling talents, to present sheep in an attractive manner, and to give the audience an opportunity to see and appreciate the beauty of wool and the animals that produce it.

The Participant awarded the highest number of total points in class 101 through 105 will be declared the winner. In the event of a tie, the winner will be determined based upon the number of bonus points awarded. The judges may interview individual contestants from a class that has concluded its presentations before those contestants are dismissed from the show ring.

There will be one (1) judge in each of the three separate categories - Participant, Sheep and Overall. Points will be awarded based on the standards for each category as outlined below.

1. Sheep (possible 60 points)

	General Appearance: Breed character, size and scale, body conformation, soundness, and wool quality representative of the breed
	or prepared
	Leading Ability: Ewe should respond calmly to the halter and "walk out" in a deliberate and natural manner
