1. Entries:

- **A.** All NWSS livestock entries are online at <u>livestockentry.nationalwestern.com</u>.
- **B.** Entry Fees: Entry fees are \$70.00 per head, and a \$25.00 per head pre-bedding fee will be added. Free parking is included with entry.
- **C. NEW for 2022:** All Yards and Hill cattle pens/stalls will be pre-bedded for a fee of \$25.00 per head entered. Exhibitors may purchase additional bedding through the NWSS Feed Store online at <u>store.nationalwestern.com</u> or on grounds during the Feed Office hours should they choose to do so.
- **D.** ASA registration numbers must be stated on entries.

2. Special Rules:

- **A.** Animals must be registered with the American Simmental Association. Animals competing in the purebred classes must all be 7/8-blood Simmental or higher. Animals competing in the percentage classes must be between 1/2-blood and less than 7/8-blood Simmental. All animals must have a legible tattoo or hide brand that matches its ASA registration number.
- **B.** This is a Progress-Through-Performance show, with ASA Ring of Champion points available (see Simmental.org). All data will be printed in the show program and provided to the judge to use in conjunction with visual appraisal.
- **C.** Streamlined Open Show check-in will take place at the ASA booth (or an otherwise announced location). Exhibitors will be asked to declare which of their entries are on-site and should be checked in for the show, and corresponding back tags will be issued at this time. Do not bring animals to check-in. Proof of registration is required at the time of check-in: Original papers, electronic versions or photocopies will be accepted. Any animal not checked in will be considered a scratch.
- **D.** Exhibitors are further expected to meet the following:
 - Any bull fifteen (15) months of age or older must have veterinary proof of a semen test &/or breeding soundness exam and must be proven as a satisfactory breeder.
 - Any female eighteen (18) months of age or older must be a) certified pregnant by a licensed

- non-owner veterinarian or b) have certification that she has been used in embryo transfer.
- **E.** Following the completion of check-in, 10% of the checked-in tattoos will be checked at random. Checks will be performed in the exhibitors' stalls by ASA staff and/or AJSA Trustees. Any animal with a tattoo that does not match its registration will be automatically disqualified from the show. ASA may check additional tattoos and/or papers on any entry.
- **F.** At check-in each exhibitor can nominate up to 2 names for future PTP judges.
- **G.** Animals that have not been processed will not be eligible to show. Show management reserves the right to bar any animal or exhibitor from showing that does not meet the requirements of this show.
- **H.** For safety, all animals must be dehorned, and all bulls twelve (12) months of age or older must be shown with a nose lead or ring.
- I. Grand and Reserve Grand Champions will have DNA samples pulled and tested for parental verification and genomics. DNA collection will occur at the exhibition site and will be supervised and/or conducted by ASA staff. ASA reserves the right to pull DNA on any competing entry. Failure to submit to DNA sampling and/or testing will result in automatic disqualification.
- **J.** CSA management reserves the right to modify classes as it sees fit, to facilitate a more uniform showing. Division breaks will be determined based on the number of entries. Likewise, classes may be split at CSA's discretion based on entries. If a class is split, premiums also may be split.
- **K.** Exhibitors are encouraged to run HD testing on their animals prior to the show. Genomically enhanced EPDs are noted in the show program.
- **L.** Show order is bulls then females, youngest to oldest in purebred, and then percentage divisions. Animals will enter the ring starting with the youngest first. All must be in the makeup area before the conclusion of the prior class. Any animal not at ring side when its class enters the ring will be scratched.
- **M. Premiums:** Premiums will be paid directly from the National Western Stock Show offices. The Colorado Simmental Association offers Champion and Reserve Champion awards. National Western Stock Show awards ribbons to winners in each class through 10th place.

	Breeder is defined as individual(s) or organization(s) listed as breeder on the registration paper and identified by ASA breeder ID number. Award based on points accumulated in individual classes on animals bred (but not necessarily owned or exhibited) by one individual or firm. Same point system as Premier Exhibitor
