1. Entries:

- A. All NWSS livestock entries are online at livestockentry.nationalwestern.com.
- B. Entry Fees to NWSS: Entry fees are \$40.00 per head, and a \$25.00 per head pre-bedding fee will be added. Free parking is included with entry.
- C. Entry Fees to American Highland Cattle Association: \$40.00 and the paper entry form provided by the AHCA must be mailed to the American Highland Cattle Association as a show fee.
- D. All Yards and Hill cattle pens/stalls will be pre-bedded for a fee of \$25.00 per head entered. Exhibitors may purchase additional bedding through the NWSS Feed Store online at store.nationalwestern.com or on grounds during the Feed Office hours should they choose to do so.
- E. AHCA registration numbers must be stated on entries.

2. Special Rules:

- A. The American Highland Cattle Association offers fifty percent (50%) or three thousand thirty-five (\$3,035.00) dollars of the total premiums offered. The National Western Stock Show offers fifty percent (50%) or three thousand thirty-five (\$3,035.00) dollars of the premiums offered. Premiums will be paid directly from the National Western Stock Show offices.
- B. All animals entered must be owned by the exhibitor and registered with the American Highland Cattle Association or the Canadian Highland Cattle Society (CHCS).
- C. Entries in the following classes are exhibited with the understanding that the owner/exhibitor agrees to abide by the rules set forth in the National Western Stock Show Premium List and the show rules of AHCA.
- D. Registration papers or current photocopies thereof must be presented to the show officials or AHCA representatives upon request. Tattoos must be legible and correspond to registration papers or the animals will not be allowed to show.
- E. Health inspection certificates must be turned in upon arrival to the veterinarian's office on the "Hill". Each sale animal must have an individual health certificate. Three (3) copies of each certificate are required. Show animals only may be listed together on one (1) health certificate but three (3) copies of this certificate are required.
- F. Classes with less than three (3) animals may be combined with other classes.

- G. Exhibitors must post an 8 1/2” x 11” card over each animal in the stall area stating: animal’s name, registration number, birth date, sire and dam.
- H. With the exception of animals in the National Sale, no “for sale” signs will be posted.
- I. No dehorned animals, except market cattle and Sovereign heifers, will be allowed to show.
- J. All bulls 12 months or older must be shown with a nose ring or nose lead or will be excluded from exhibition at the discretion of Stock Show and in the interest of safety to spectators.
- K. National Western Stock Show awards ribbons through 5th place.

HIGHLAND JACKPOT GROUP

- Show begins after Junior Show. This show is a jackpot format. All premiums paid by AHCA directly.
 - All fullblood breeding animals must have been entered in individual classes. All animals must be owned by same owner.
- 501 Best Pair of Heifers
502 Best Pair of Bulls
503 Best Three Head - three (3) animals - limit one (1) bull per entry.

SOVEREIGN HEIFER AND MARKET ANIMAL (STEERS & HEIFERS) SHOW RULES

- Cattle must be raised and handled in a humane manner. No added hormones, anabolic steroids or sub therapeutic feed antibiotics can be applied/fed.
- All entries must comply with NWSS Livestock Health Requirements.
- Market cattle must be minimum weight of 900 pounds on show day. Finishing during the final 100 days should be such that each animal gains at least 1.5 lbs. per day.
- Market cattle must be a maximum of 30 months old.
- Feeder animals must be maximum weight of 899 lbs. on show day.
- Fullblood market animals must be from a registered Highland sire and dam. Crossbred animals must be from a registered sire or dam. Registered Sovereign heifers must be polled, scurred or dehorned. Market cattle may be horned or dehorned.
- Sovereign heifers must be registered with AHCA.
- Market cattle may be registered with AHCA, however it is not required. Only registered animals count towards Premier Breeder and Exhibitor. Unregistered market cattle must be tattooed with the original owner's herd letters. This tattoo along with sire and dam registration names and numbers must be noted on the entry form.
- The market show may be divided into more than one class (by weight) depending on number

of entries. The feeder and prospect classes may be divided into more than one class (by age) depending on number of entries.
