- 1. Entries:
 - A. All NWSS livestock entries are online at https://nwssrs.fairwire.com/.
 - B. Entry Fees: Entry fees are \$65.00 per head, and a \$25.00 per head pre-bedding fee will be added. Free vehicle parking is included with entry. Trailer parking is available for a fee at Dicks Sporting Goods Field. Information can be found at Nationalwestern.com
 - C. All Yards and Hill cattle pens/stalls will be pre-bedded for a fee of \$25.00 per head entered. Exhibitors may purchase additional bedding through the NWSS Feed Store on the grounds during the Feed Office hours should they choose to do so.
 - D. AMAA registration numbers must be stated on entries.
- 2. Special Rules:
 - A. Exhibitors are subject to all rules and regulations of the American Maine-Anjou Association. When an entry is made, exhibitors agree to abide by the rules and regulations established by the AMAA as well as the rules of the Show Management. Entries found to be misrepresented, or persons not abiding by the show rules, may be disqualified from showing.
 - B. All animals must be registered in the AMAA or CMAA and the original certificate is required for presentation before the show.
 - C. All animals must be seventy-five percent (75%) Maine-Anjou or greater in the Maine-Anjou Show. Maine-Angus Qualifications: All Maine Angus Females must be TH and PHA Free by either parents or test have an AMAA-issued Maine Angus registration paper and meet MaineAngus color requirements.
 - D. Bulls and females in the MaineTainer Division must be registered 1/4 5/8's Maine-Anjou.
 - E. Tattoo will be checked, must be legible, and correspond exactly with the registration certificate. Other than the Brucellosis Calf hood tattoo, there shall be no other permanent identification marks other than those noted on the certificate of registry.
 - F. The attempted surgical or non-surgical alteration of the conformation of an animal is prohibited, except for dehorning. Cattle are to be shown in their natural conformation.
 - G. The use of false tail heads or adding hair or other material to any part of the animal is prohibited.
 - H. The dying or artificial changing of the existing color pattern and color will be prohibited.
 - I. No artificial filling allowed (no pumps).
 - J. All horned animals over seven (7) months of age must be dehorned.
 - K. Any and all cattle shall be made available to have hair pulled for parentage verification. If

recorded parent is excluded as a result of DNA, the owner may at his expense, request the AMAA determine actual parent. Failure to determine parentage will result in a review before the AMAA Executive Committee.

- L. Bulls ten (10) months of age and older shall be shown with a bull lead in place.
- M. Heifers exhibited at twenty (20) months of age or older must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy. For heifers used in embryo transfer, a certificate of positive fertility issued by a licensed veterinarian must be available for inspection.
- N. Bulls exhibited at fourteen (14) months of age or older must have had a positive semen test, and a certificate to that effect must be available for inspection.
- O. Bulls exhibited must be TH/PHA free by test or parentage.
- P. Exhibitors shall wear show harnesses to exhibit entry numbers and performance data cards for all AMAA sponsored shows.
- Q. Classes of animals shall be split as near to equal numbers as possible by the show superintendents.
- R. Premiums and Awards: The American Maine-Anjou Association offers five thousand (\$5,000.00) dollars of the premiums offered. National Western Stock Show offers five thousand (\$5,000.00) of the premiums and all premiums will be paid directly from the National Western Stock Show offices. National Western Stock Show awards ribbons to winners in each class through 5th place.
