# 1. Entries:

- A. All NWSS livestock entries are online atnwssrs.fairwire.com.
- B. Entry Fees: Entry fees are \$40.00 per head, and a \$25.00 per head pre-bedding fee will be added. Free vehicle parking is included with entry. Trailer Parking is available at Dicks Sporting Goods Field with a fee. Information can be found online.
- C. All Yards and Hill cattle pens/stalls will be pre-bedded for a fee of \$25.00 per head entered. Exhibitors may purchase additional bedding through the NWSS Feed Store on the grounds during the Feed Office hours should they choose to do so.
- D. AHA registration numbers must be stated on entries.
- 2. Special Rules:
  - A. All cattle, including calves on the side of cow-calf pairs and senior yearlings entered must be registered in the Herd Book of the American Hereford Association. Entries with registrations "pending" or illegible tattoos, or improper tattoos as shown on the registration certificate at check-in time are ineligible for competition. Exhibitors are subject to the American Hereford Association's special rule on class qualification. Entries in these classes are accepted with the understanding that the exhibitor agrees to abide by the rule in all respects.
  - B. The exhibition of cattle displaying false hair will not be allowed.
  - C. Any product administered internally or used externally to alter the conformation of an animal for exhibition is prohibited. This includes the use of graphite, hemp, or other similar substances externally and steroids or growth stimulants internally.
  - D. The act of artificially filling animals internally. Which includes stomach pumping, drench tubes, or any other method by mouth or esophagus is prohibited.
  - E. All animals shown in group classes must have been shown in their respective single-age class. No transfer from one (1) breeder to another, after entry, will be permitted.
  - F. Expected Progeny Difference (EPD) values will be provided to the judge and audience for all animals shown. Animals without EPD data are eligible to show but will have N/A (not available) in place of missing data.
  - G. Any animal without a legible tattoo will not be eligible to show.
  - H. All Hereford animals must be officially recorded (registered) thirty (30) days prior to the show date

to be eligible to show at a National Hereford Show.

- I. An animal that is scurred (Scurs are small, rudimentary horns that are loosely attached to the head, which are considered to be expressed only in animals that are genetically heterozygous for the polled gene) will show in the polled division of Hereford shows. Once an animal is confirmed to be scurred by an AHA field representative, then this designation will be placed on the animal's registration papers. Once this determination has been made and reported to the AHA office, then the owner may remove the scurs. Animals with scurs removed will show in the polled division of Hereford shows. Once an animal is confirmed polled or scurred they will retain this designation forever.
- J. It is recommended by the AHA Show Committee that classes with 10 or more head be considered to be split, depending on the animals' birthdates in each particular class.
- K. If the number of classes in a division warrants, a division will be split into multiple divisions
- L. Calves on the side of cow-calf pairs MUST BE the cow's natural calf
- M. For cattle exhibited at the National Western Stock Show:
- Exhibitors with senior bull calves and/or intermediate, yearling, and senior bulls are required to provide a licensed veterinarian's statement indicating the bull has been semen checked and evaluated as fertile. Semen evaluation is to occur within 90 days of the show. This statement must be presented at check-in during the National Western.
- Exhibitors with females in the spring and junior yearling divisions must be confirmed pregnant within 45 days of show by a licensed veterinarian or by blood test.
- 3. Hereford Show Classification Rules:
  - A. The female classes will consist of females born between June 30, 2024, and August 1, 2022
  - B. The bull classes will consist of bulls born between June 30, 2023, and January 1, 2022
  - C. The cow/calf classes will consist of any females born before August 1, 2022, with a calf at side. Calf is eligible for individual classes but must be entered in the appropriate class.

#### HEREFORD FEMALES - HORNED

Cow Calf (Any female older than the below-listed ages with a calf at side).

- Calf older than 240 days of age on the show date is not eligible to show in cow/calf class.
- In the cow/calf class, if the cow is horned and the calf polled then the pair will show in the horned cow/calf class and if the cow is polled and the calf is horned then the pair will show in the polled cow/calf class.
  - Calf is eligible for individual classes but must be entered in the appropriate class. Cow/Calf does not compete for overall champion female.)

- Calf is eligible for individual classes but must be entered in the appropriate class. Cow/Calf does not compete for overall champion female.)

#### HEREFORD GROUPS

- G e t -of-Sire: Four animals shown in the above single-entry classes with both sexes represented and all to be the progeny of one sire. It is permissible to use either the cow or calf from a cow/calf pair for the Get-of-Sire. Get-of-Sire may be comprised of animals from one or more owners and of both horned and polled animals.
- Best Six Head: Owned by Exhibitor. All animals must have been shown in their respective single-entry classes and they must be owned by exhibitor or by a member of his/her immediate family. A cow/calf will be considered as two head in the Best Six Head class.

# PREMIER BREEDER/PREMIER EXHIBITOR

Awarded with the following point system:

No points will be given for champions. Points will be awarded for the Best Six Head for Premier Exhibitor. In the result of a tie, show staff will review the division placing of each exhibitor/ breeder, with the award being presented to the exhibitor/breeder with the highest number of division placings. If a tie remains, show staff will review the number of animals shown for the exhibitor/breeder, the higher number exhibited will win the tie.

The same scoring system as above will be used for awarding points for the group classes. It is suggested that banners be given to the Premier Exhibitor and Premier Breeder
