1. Entries:

A. All NWSS livestock entries are online at https://nwssrs.fairwire.com/.

- B. Entry Fees: Entry fees are \$40.00 per head and a \$25.00 per head pre-bedding fee will be added. Free vehicle parking is included with entry. Trailer parking is available at Dicks Sporting Goods Field. Information can be found at nationalwestern.com
- C. All Yards and Hill cattle pens/stalls will be pre-bedded for a fee of \$25.00 per head entered. Exhibitors may purchase additional bedding through the NWSS Feed Store on the grounds during the Feed Office hours should they choose to do so.
- D. RAAA registration numbers must be stated on entries.

2. Special Rules:

OWNERSHIP REQUIREMENTS:

Open Show:

- A. All animals entered will have at least one owner on record as a Regular or Junior Member of RAAA at the time of the Regional or National Shows' check-in.
- B. Purebred females must be registered with the Red Angus Association of America (RAAA) and meet all requirements for Category 1A or 1B at the time of the Regional or National show's published entry deadline. Category 1A and 1B cattle will show together in the same class.

C. ***NEW RULE***

DNA: Parent verification must be completed on the individual animal and verified to the greatest extent possible before shown. (Implementation date RAYE 2024 and all upcoming Regional and National shows. Ruling passed at January Board meeting) All Grand and Reserve Champions and overall animals in all shows will have DNA collected to be parentage verified to the greatest extent.

Please submit your DNA as soon as possible to allow ample time for the lab to process for all Regional and National shows.

D. Have Official Registered Status at the time of Regional or National Shows' published show checking.

Red Angus Junior Show:

- A. To be eligible to show in the Red Angus Junior Show, each exhibitor must be a Member of the National Junior Red Angus Association at time of the show's check-in.
- B. Substitutions will only be permitted for animals within sex.

C. ***NEW RULE***

General Regulations:

- A. Entries are accepted with the understanding that each exhibitor agrees to conform to the Rules and Regulations of the RAAA. Enforcement will be at the discretion of the RAAA authorized representatives and may include barring an animal or exhibitor.
- B. Exhibitors shall exhibit sportsmanship and professional behavior in and around the show ring. Abusive, discourteous, or threatening behavior towards judges, show officials, fellow exhibitors or RAAA-authorized representatives will not be tolerated.
- C. All animals must have legible tattoos, which match the Animal ID and Herd Prefix as recorded in the RAAA database prior to processing.
- D. Animal ID and Herd Prefix verification may be via printed registration certificate or real-time electronic representation of the RAAA database.
- E. If the Animal ID and/or Herd Prefix are not legible and cannot be read during processing,

it will be allowed to participate in the show. A fee of \$100 will be charged to the exhibitor

for a DNA parentage test of said animal.

- F. If the animal ID and/or Herd Prefix are legible but are incorrect and/or no visible indications of a tattoo in either ear, the animal will not be allowed to show.
- G. Each animal will be exhibited in its natural conformation and structure and without any alterations or modifications, with the exception of acceptable fitting and grooming practices.
- H. The use of paints and/or the addition of any hair or hair-like substances will not be allowed.
- I. At the time of processing, all females 20 months of age or older on the published date of the show must have one of the following:
- J. Certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinarian.
- K. Written statement by a licensed veterinarian or embryologist of having produced fertile eggs.
- L. A female's own natural born calf at side, (the calf may not be a ET calf) which need not be registered, but must be eligible for category 1A or 1B registration in the RAAA
- M. All bulls 9 months of age or older on the published date of show must be shown with a nose lead.
- N. After processing, should the number of entries in any class exceed practicality, authorized representatives of the RAAA have the authority to "split" classes according to age and at

- date of birth which best encourages fair competition.
- O. Any calf exhibited at the side of their dam in a cow/calf class may be exhibited in an individual class subject to all pertinent RAAA Show Rules and Classifications.
- P. Any exhibitor who loses control of his/her animal twice in the show ring will be required to remove the animal from the ring.

- 401 Senior Get-of-Sire Four (4) animals by the same sire, both sexes represented, need not be owned by the exhibitor. All animals must have been shown in their respective classes.
- 402 Junior Get-of-Sire Three (3) animals by the same sire, both sexes represented, need not be owned by the exhibitor. Entries must have been calved on or after September 1, 2022. All animals must have been shown in their respective classes.
- 403 Produce-of-Dam Two (2) animals, either or both sexes, both shown in their respective classes. Animals shown in this class need not be owned by the exhibitor.
- **Premier Breeder Class** Will be computed from the breeder's placement in individual classes only as follows: three (3) points for each 1st; two (2) points for each 2nd; one (1) point for each 3rd. The maximum number of placements to be used to determine the winner shall be limited to 5. Calculated on breeders of animals for exhibitors only. (In case of a tie,

the next highest individual class placement will be used to determine the winner). **Premier Exhibitor Class** -Will be computed from the exhibitor's placing in individual classes, only as follows; three (3) points for each 1st; two (2) points for each 2nd; one (1) point for each 3rd. The maximum number of placements to be used to determine the winner shall be limited to five (5). (In case of a tie, group class placement will be used to determine the winner).
